

Lazarus House provides nutritious breakfasts and lunches through our 7-day a week Soup Kitchen. Our weekly Food Pantry also provides supplemental groceries to over 1,000 families. We provide food to anyone who is hungry.

Did You Know?

We served over 50,000 bags of food in our Food Pantry in 2021.
